Together with Kacper Tekielli, we managed to use the stay in Norway until the very end, leading on a nearby wall, requiring a technically new road.

Conditions were far from ideal. Snowfall over the night and in the morning and the temperature around zero did not make climbing easier, especially because in these conditions (previous days were warm) the grass was very or very poorly "kept". Moisture on the road was ubiquitous.

The road runs with a system of scratches and chimneys offering top quality climbing with fairly good belaying. On the road outside the standard equipment, BD number 4 and 5 are useful - thanks to Paweł;).

I have to add here that the line of this path was on my mind from the moment when I first looked at this wall, and it was in 2013.

The wall is not outstanding in comparison to the nearby Goyksoyra, but it has an elevation of 450 to 500m. However, when there is no time for climbing a few days or the weather does not spoil, it is perfect.

In good weather conditions the road definitely recommendable - according to us in the Tatras it would be a difficult mega classic.

Inspired by our younger colleagues, we named it:

"There is no pleasure without humidity", M7 + valuation, 500m.

We managed to make the way through the OS, but I must point out that the first 30m of the second lift I knew from the "dry-drift games" from 6 years ago, while during the road with Kacper it was the first three lifts that he performed in the OS.
